

It is Remembered that hereof

 ceedings had been taken upon said Will, that one
 of the parties cited was a minor, having no
 general guardian residing in the State of New
 York, a Special Guardian was appointed in due
 form of law to take care of his interests in the
 matter of proving said Will by an order duly
 entered for that purpose, by said Surrogate, and
 said Special Guardian having duly appeared
 on that day no one appearing to oppose the
 probate of said Will, such proceedings were there-
 upon had afterwards, that said Surrogate
 the proofs of said Will, hereinafter set forth
 upon this eighteenth day of April, in the year
 one thousand eight hundred and eighty two,
 adjudged said Will to be a valid Will of said

Second I hereby give devise and bequeath all and singular my estate real and personal whatsoever and wheresoever unto my beloved wife Olga Goodchild, To Have and To Hold the same unto her, her heirs executors administrators and assigns forever.

Third I hereby nominate and appoint my said wife, sole executrix of this my last will and testament and guardian of my children during their minority.

Fourth In case my said wife shall die before me then I give devise and bequeath my said estate unto my three children, Edward, James Henry, and George Thomas, To Have and to hold the same unto them share and share alike, and unto their respective heirs executors administrators and assigns forever and in case any of the said children shall die before me leaving issue such issue shall take the share the parent would have taken if living but in case any of them shall die before me without leaving issue, me surviving, the share that such deceased child would have taken shall go and be divided equally among the survivors of my said children and the issue of any of them that shall have died before me leaving issue me surviving, such issue to take the share the parent would have taken if living.
